Hymns We Love to Sing "Jesus Christ is Risen Today" LSB 457

Jesus Christ is ris'n today. Alleluia! Our Triumphant holy day, Alleluia! Who did once upon the cross, Alleluia! Suffer to redeem our loss. Alleluia!

Hymns of praise then let us sing, Alleluia! Unto Christ, our heav'nly king, Alleluia! Who endured the cross and grave. Alleluia! Sinners to redeem and save. Alleluia!

But the pains which he endured, Alleluia! Our salvation have procured; Alleluia! Now above the sky he's king, Alleluia! Where the angels ever sing. Alleluia!

Sing we to our God above, Alleluia! Praise eternal as his love; Alleluia! Praise him, all you heav'nly host, Alleluia! Father, Son and Holy Ghost. Alleluia!

This is a favorite hymn of many for Easter Sunday. It exudes the triumph of Jesus' resurrection both by the text and by the tune. The text is mishmash of several sources. It doesn't show up in the form we know until the publication of a hymnal in London in 1749. The first verse is based on an old Latin text, "Surrexit Christus hodie" (tr. Christ Rose Today).

This dates back to the 14th century and shows up in German manuscripts as "Erstanden ist der Heilig Christ" (tr. The Holy Christ has Risen). The first verse shows up in English in Lyrica Davidica in London, 1708.

The second and third verses are quite different in that printing than what we have today. The following are those verses.

"Haste ye females from your fright, Take to Galilee your flight, to his sad disciples say Jesus Christ is risen today."

"In our Paschal joy and feast, let the Lord of life be blest, Let the Holy triune be prais'd, And thankful hearts to heaven be rais'd"

The fourth stanza (the Trinitarian proclamation) that we are familiar with was added later by the skillful pen of Charles Wesley, made popular in an 1816 publication.

It is interesting to note that the first and third stanzas are historical facts of the resurrection and the second and fourth are about our response of praise to Jesus' victory over death for us.

The joyous tune to which we sing this hymn is entitled "Easter Hymn." It has been paired with this hymn all the way back to the Lyrica Davidica songbook published in 1708.



Greg Paul, Teacher

I love my job at St. Paul Church and School. As teacher I am able to work with students of all ages in two subjects that I am passionate about. Music and Science. I was called to be teacher and musician to St. Paul in spring of 1984. For my first twenty years I taught 5th grade homeroom and directed the three school choirs (Cherub, Choristers and Jr Chancel) and the bell choir. I played the organ for worship services and directed the adult Chancel Choir, and began the adult Handbell Choir at the church. In fall of 2005 I moved upstairs to the 7th and 8th homeroom and taught the Middle School Sciences along with the various school choirs. I no longer have a homeroom but still teach Science and Music classes throughout the school. I currently teach 4th Science, 5/6 Science and 7/8th Science, Preschool Music, Kindergarten Music, 1/2nd Music, 3rd Music, Advancing Band, School Choir, Jr. Chancel Choir and Jr. Bell Choir.

Music has long been an important part of my life. Ten years of piano lessons, then undergraduate and masters level organ lessons and years of playing horn (one year with a community orchestra in St. Louis during High School) have given me a strong foundation for understanding and teaching music. My choral abilities were developed in College, singing under Dr. Paul Foelber at Concordia College, Ann Arbor and Professor Ed Martens at Concordia College, Seward, NE. Over time and through many workshops I have refined my choral directing abilities and I find leading choirs to be one of my great sources of joy.

I have always been a "hands on" "how does this work" sort of guy which gives me a love for science. God created such a magnificent world with all its life, the pinnacle of which is us, made in His image. Though the curse of sin has seriously tainted creation, all of his works, even though under the curse of sin, still shouts his magnificence and order in what he made. As a Christian I love to explore how his creation works, and that is how I view Science, figuring out the universe that God created, and studying the great accomplishments of people of science throughout history.

My father was a Lutheran pastor and I grew up in a home where faith was a part of everyday life. I am so thankful for my Christian parents who taught me the love of Jesus. They are both with the Lord. My faith is central to my life. It is central to my understanding and performance of Music and central to my understanding of Science. In all that I do I strive to do all to the glory of God. I see my role of teacher and musician at St. Paul to be one of teaching and modeling the faith to those I come in contact with. I am far from perfect and have many flaws but by the grace of God I seek to strengthen the faith of those around me. I close with Johann Sebastian Bach's identifying mark on his music, SDG, Soli Deo Goria, to God Alone be Glory.
